Good evening. This meeting of the governing board of the San Carlos Park Fire Protection and Rescue Service District is being conducted remotely consistent with Florida Governor DeSantis' Executive Order 20-69 of March 20, 2020 amended by EO 20-179, EO 20-193, due to the current State of Emergency throughout the State of Florida given the outbreak of the novel coronavirus, COVID-19.
