CHIEF'S REPORT

Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Audit Update – Chief Cambareri informed the Board that the district is in the process of completing our 2018/2019 audit and it is tentatively scheduled for presentation in May.

MDA Annual Boot Drive – Chief Cambareri announced that this year's MDA boot drive has been postponed due to the COVID-19 concerns.

Thank you Letters – Chief Cambareri presented the Board with a thank you letter from Deputy Chief Richards Tonks from the City of St. Cloud Fire Rescue Department. The District donated bunker gear for their cadet program.

Fire & Rescue Calls – The San Carlos Park Fire Protection and Rescue Service District ran 393 fire and rescue calls for the month of February 2020. Chief Cambareri thanked all staff for their continued commitment to the organization. Chief Cambareri presented the monthly fire/rescue comparison sheet.

Delivery of GMP for Station 54 (Wright Construction Group) – Chief Cambareri presented the Board with the GMP from Wright Construction Group for station 54. Discussion ensued. With all questions answered, a motion was made:

Commissioner Weinbaum motioned to retain Wright Construction Group to complete the station 54 build and authorized Chief Cambareri to move forward with obtaining a loan for the construction. Commissioner Stirns seconded. *The motion was voted upon, with no questions, the motion carried unanimously.*

Marine 50 - Chief Cambareri announced that Marine 50 has been christened and training will begin shortly.

2004 Ford Expedition – The retired rescue truck has been successfully bid on and is no longer property of the District per guidance from the Board of Commissioners.

Covered Training Structure - Chief Cambareri updated the Board on the training structure located at station 53. Work has been completed.

Plans Review Update – The District and Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District have entered into a agreement on February 28, 2020. This agreement allows FMBFCD to review the District fire plans.

COVID-19 Update – Chief Cambareri discussed the COVID-19 pandemic and informed the Board that Division Chief Dan Sieber is working on updating current guidelines.

Station 54 Groundbreaking Ceremony – Assistant Chief Rison announced that once the fill was complete on the future site of station 54 a groundbreaking ceremony will be scheduled.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SAN CARLOS PARK FIRE PROTECTION AND RESCUE SERVICE DISTRICT TO ENTER INTO AN ANNUALLY RENEWABLE LEASE PURCHASE TRANSACTION WITH CAPITAL ONE PUBLIC FUNDING, LLC, THE PROCEEDS OF WHICH WILL BE USED TO PAY THE COSTS OF ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING, EQUIPPING AND INSTALLING A FIRE STATION FACILITY; AND AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF CERTAIN DOCUMENTS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

WHEREAS, San Carlos Park Fire Protection and Rescue Service District (the "District"), desires to obtain moneys to pay for the acquisition, construction, equipping and installation of a fire station facility and related facilities (the "Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, in order to facilitate the acquisition, construction, equipping and installation of the Improvements and to pay a portion of the cost thereof, it is necessary and desirable for the District to take the following actions:

- 1. Enter into a Base Lease (the "Base Lease"), in substantially the form attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, with Capital One Public Funding, LLC (the "Lender"), pursuant to which the District will lease certain real property (the "Land") to the Lender;
- 2. Enter into a Lease Purchase Agreement (the "Lease"), in substantially the form attached hereto as **Exhibit B**, with the Lender, pursuant to which the District will lease the Land and the Improvements (together, the "Project") from the Lender on a year-to-year basis with an option to purchase the Lender's interest in the Project;
- 3. Enter into an Escrow Agreement (the "Escrow Agreement"), in substantially the form attached hereto as **Exhibit C**, with the Lender and the escrow agent named therein, as escrow agent (the "Escrow Agent"), pursuant to which the proceeds of the Lease and certain other moneys of the District deposited therein prior to completion of the Project will be held in trust by the Escrow Agent in a project fund to pay costs of the Improvements and certain costs of issuance in connection with the Lease; and
- 4. Enter into a Federal Tax Agreement (the "Tax Agreement"), in substantially the form attached hereto as **Exhibit D**, setting forth certain representations, facts, expectations, terms and conditions relating to the use and investment of the proceeds of the Lease in order to establish and maintain the exclusion of the interest portion of rental payments thereunder from gross income for federal income tax purposes and in order to provide guidance for complying with the arbitrage rebate provisions of the Internal Revenue Code upon the terms and conditions as set forth in the Tax Agreement.

(the Base Lease, the Lease, the Escrow Agreement and the Tax Agreement are referred to herein as the "District Documents.")

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS OF SAN CARLOS PARK FIRE PROTECTION AND RESCUE SERVICE DISTRICT, AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1. Findings and Determinations.** It is hereby found and determined that the terms of the Lease (including the description of the Project and amortization schedule for rental payments) as presented to the Board of Fire Commissioners of the District at this meeting, are in the best interests of the District for the acquisition, construction, equipping and installation of the Improvements.
- Section 2. Authorization and Approval of the District Documents. The District Documents are hereby approved in substantially the forms submitted to and reviewed by the Board of Fire Commissioners of the District on the date hereof, with such insertions, omissions and changes therein as shall be approved by the Chairperson of the Board of Fire Commissioners of the District or his designee (the "Authorized Officer") executing the same, the execution thereof to be conclusive evidence of the such approval.

The Authorized Officer is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the District Documents on behalf of the District in substantially the forms presented at this meeting

- **Section 3. Reimbursement.** The District expects to make capital expenditures after the date of the adoption of this Resolution in connection with the Improvements, and the District intends to reimburse itself for such expenditures and also expenditures made with respect to the Improvements on or after sixty days before the date of this Resolution with proceeds of the Lease.
- Section 4. No General Liability. The obligation of the District to pay Rental Payments (as defined in the Lease) is subject to annual appropriation and will constitute a current expense of the District and will not in any way be construed to be an indebtedness or liability of the District in contravention of any applicable constitutional or statutory limitation or requirement concerning the creation of indebtedness or liability by the District, nor will anything contained in the Lease constitute a pledge of the general tax revenues or funds of the District, and all provisions of the Lease will be construed so as to give effect to such intent. The Rental Payments under the Lease will be limited obligations of the District, subject to annual appropriation, as provided in the Lease.
- Section 5. Further Authority. The District will, and the officials and agents of the District are hereby authorized and directed to, take such action, expend such funds (including transaction costs of the District related to the District Documents) and execute such other documents, certificates and instruments as may be necessary or desirable to carry out and comply with the intent of this Resolution and to carry out, comply with and perform the duties of the District with respect to the District Documents, the other documents authorized or approved hereby and the Project.
- **Section 6. Effective Date.** This Resolution will take effect and be in full force from and after its adoption by the Board of Fire Commissioners.

STATE OF FLORIDA

OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 20-69

(Emergency Management – COVID-19 – Local Government Public Meetings)

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-51 directing the Florida Department of Health to issue a Public Health Emergency as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2020, the State Surgeon General and State Health Officer declared a Public Health Emergency exists in the State of Florida as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-52 declaring a state of emergency for the entire State of Florida as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, President Donald J. Trump and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") issued the "15 Days to Slow the Spread" guidance advising individuals to adopt far-reaching social distancing measures, such as working from home and avoiding gatherings of more than 10 people; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, I wrote a letter to Attorney General Ashley Moody seeking an advisory opinion regarding concerns raised by local government bodies about their ability to hold meetings through teleconferencing and other technological means in order to protect the public and follow the CDC guidance regarding social distancing; and

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, Attorney General Ashley Moody delivered an opinion to me indicating that certain provisions of Florida law require a physical quorum be present for local government bodies to conduct official business, and that local government bodies may only conduct meetings by teleconferencing or other technological means if either a statute permits a quorum to be present by means other than in person, or that the in person requirement for constituting a quorum is lawfully suspended during the state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and appropriate to take action to ensure that COVID-19 remains controlled, and that residents and visitors in Florida remain safe and secure;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RON DESANTIS, as Governor of Florida, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Article IV, Section (1)(a) of the Florida Constitution, Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, and all other applicable laws, promulgate the following Executive Order to take immediate effect:

Section 1. I hereby suspend any Florida Statute that requires a quorum to be present in person or requires a local government body to meet at a specific public place.

Section 2. Local government bodies may utilize communications media technology, such as telephonic and video conferencing, as provided in section 120.54(5)(b)2., Florida Statutes.

Section 3. This Executive Order does not waive any other requirement under the Florida Constitution and "Florida's Government in the Sunshine Laws," including Chapter 286, Florida Statutes.

Section 4. This Executive Order shall expire at the expiration of Executive Order 20-52, including any extension.

EMERGENCY ORDER 2020-02 SAN CARLOS PARK FIRE DISTRICT GOVERNING BOARD TIME PLACE AND RULES

WHEREAS, Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a severe acute respiratory illness that can spread among humans through respiratory transmission and presents with symptoms similar to those of influenza; and

WHEREAS, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-52, declaring a state of emergency for the entire State of Florida as a result of COVID-19 on March 9, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Governor DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-69, suspending Florida statutory law requiring a quorum to be present for local government bodies to conduct official business or requiring a local government to meet at a specific public place, and further authorizing local government bodies to utilize communications media technology, such as telephonic and video conferencing, as provided in Section 120.54(5)(b)2, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Statutes and possible rules of the District may provide for specific time and place, as well as rules of conduct governing meetings of the Board of the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, the Chairman of the governing board of the San Carlos Park Fire District does hereby issue the following emergency provisions regarding District governing board meetings to take immediate effect:

- 1. The provisions of the Florida Statutes and District rules relating to time, place, and conduct of meetings of the District governing board are hereby suspended.
- 2. The District governing board is hereby authorized to utilize communications media technology, such as telephonic and video conferencing, as provided for in Executive Order 20-69 issued by Governor DeSantis on March 20, 2020.
- 4. The District Manager is hereby authorized to adopt administrative rules that are deemed necessary and appropriate to implement communications media technology and to set time, place and rules of conduct and procedures for District governing board meetings.
- 5. This Emergency Order shall remain in effect until the expiration date of Governor DeSantis' Executive Order EO-20-69, including any extensions thereof.
